bullying and how to seek help from appropriate adults if required. Our school always continues to enforce clear processes to promote positive behaviours (School Wide Positive Behaviour Matrix) and prevent bullying (as outlined in our Bullying Prevention Policy). Both of these documents are available to be viewed by our community on the school website. The school maintains a strict no bullying policy. As outlined in our policy we



will work to support and educate students and families when required. Consequences for breaking our school rules will be enforced according to the policies and each situation. As we all know, it is important that we, the school, and families work together at all times to support the students at school. I ask that if your child reports an incident at home that you think



needs to be discussed, you support us by contacting your child's classroom teacher. Together we can work through the situation to ensure students learn from these experiences, change behaviour if required and maintain a safe and secure learning environment.

I wanted to remind everyone that the play equipment is out of bounds before school and after school. Students will be able to use the equipment at Recess and Lunchtime when there are teachers on duty in all the areas of the school. Before and after school we

have one staff member on duty to help students come into school and leave school safely. Thank you to all our parents for supporting us with enforcing these rules by discussing them with your children.


