After a lot of investigation, we finally came up with a project idea, it was called the 'Bird of Prey' drone and it was



based on a local family of Pelicans. The idea was that each week, people would volunteer to fly our drone, which looks like a Pelican, around Patterson River and Carrum Beach to scan for small rubbish, then once it spots something, the controller would simply fly it down and using the Pelican's big beak, and

This week in 3/4 we have been learning about maths, reading, writing and inquiry.







Last year, schools collected over 10 tonnes of soft plastic, that's the weight of an elephant!


