

As we are still in the middle of winter, please be aware that Health professionals in Victoria are seeing a high number of cases of influenza (flu) and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) in children aged 5 to 11 years, particularly in children in their first few years of school.

The Victorian Department of Health anticipates respiratory

infections will continue to increase in the first few weeks of Term 3, 2023.

Most children with respiratory

illness experience mild to moderate symptoms such as fever, runny nose or cough.

Some children, particularly babies and children with underlying medical conditions, can develop more severe illness.

To reduce the spread of flu and respiratory illnesses staff will be encouraging students to:

wash and sanitise their hands regularly

- avoid touching their eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands
- cover their nose and mouth when they cough or sneeze

We ask families to reiterate these messages at home with their children and support us by:

- · keeping your child home if unwell and consult your doctor as required
- staying up to date with your child's flu and COVID-19 vaccinations

Ahead of NAPLAN results for students being released from Monday 17 July 2023, I wanted to inform you of some changes to this year's reporting. These are changes being introduced nationally by the Australian Curriculum Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA). NAPLAN will continue to measure student achievement in numeracy, reading, writing, spelling, and grammar and punctuation but the results will now be presented in 4 proficiency levels:

These are:

- exceeding
- strong
- developing
- needs additional support.

This change will give schools, parents and carers clearer information that details student achievement against new proficiency levels.

Students' NAPLAN reports will continue to show how they are tracking against their peers and





provide an indication of their skill levels against national averages and where we would expect them to be in order to get the most out of schooling. This provides valuable information to teachers about how we can continue to support your child.

Each set of NAPLAN results is an important milestone but it's also important that students know that one result does not define them - these results are about making sure every student gets the support they need so they can continue to get the best from their learning.

When we provide you with your results, you will also receive information about what the new proficiency levels mean.

As always, you're welcome to speak to me, or your child's teacher with any questions about these changes. If you need to do so, please contact us at the school.

This term we continue to develop our wellbeing programs in all classrooms. Teachers will continue to work with the students during circle time and class time to teach our respectful relationships curriculum. As part of this program our teachers will work with students on using **Zones of Regulation** to help them understand how they and other people are feeling at different time during the day. You will see Zones of Regulation Charts up in classrooms and in the galleries spaces to support students with identifying how they are feeling and what to do when they are not in the Green Zone (ready to learn/play) to regulate their behaviour. This work is

important and takes time for students to be able to use the strategies at the right times to manage their emotions. Further information on Zones of Regulation can be accessed by contacting your child's classroom teacher.

- 3. Submit an enrolment application for Foundation (Prep) by **Friday 28 July 2023**.
- 4. You will be notified of the outcome of your application by **Friday 11 August 2023**. If you receive an offer of placement, you should contact our school to accept the offer by **Friday 25 August 2023**.

If you require further information about enrolling your child at the school please contact the office or visit our website.

This program is at no cost to families and provides the students with 8 lessons over two weeks that help develop their swimming skills and water safety understandings. 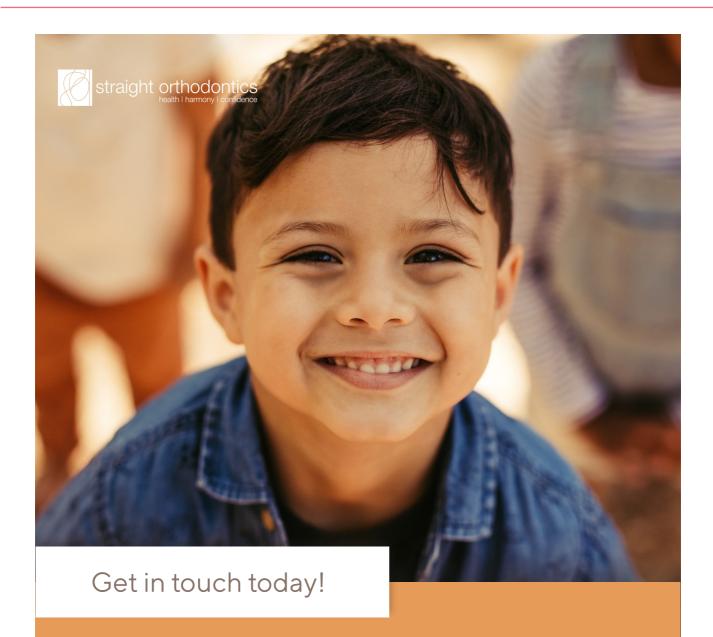


