always look for what we can do to improve but at this point in time I think it is important to take a breath and celebrate our students achievements. At Carrum Primary School our students consistently punch above their weight in academic results. This is a great credit to our students and staff for their hard work and love of learning.

This term staff have been experimenting with sensory equipment to support students who may require hands on supports to help with focus and engagement. While we have asked families not to send fidget spinners



or other home toys to school without speaking to teachers first, our staff have invested in school equipment that teachers can use as part of learning plans for students that may require them. Our staff do an amazing job at working with parents and carers to set up individual supports for students. The teachers will reflect on recommendations from specialists and ensure we can do our best to cater for each



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student's needs. If you do have equipment at home that would be beneficial for teachers to use to support your child at school please speak to your child's classroom teacher and they can decide if this is something that would be suitable to be used in the classroom.

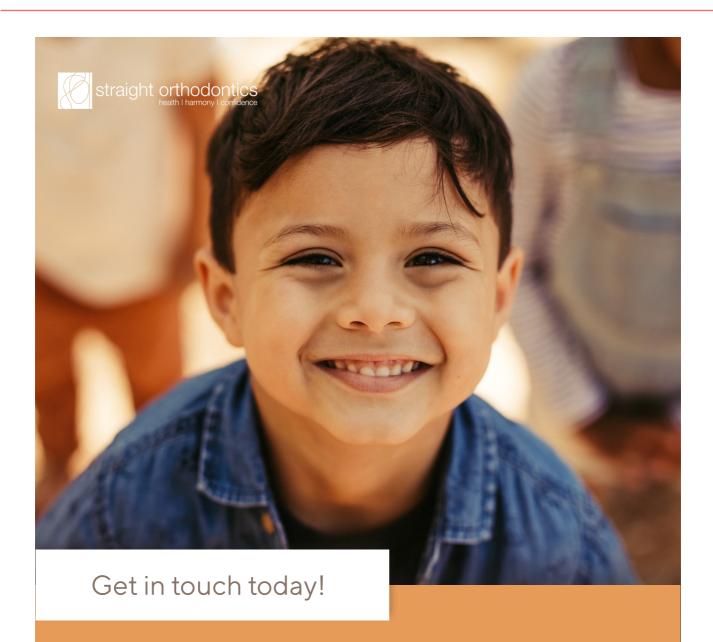
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
