


One of the areas that we know we do well as a school is to create a safe and secure learning environment.

This has been endorsed very strongly by our students when they completed the **Attitudes to School Survey** earlier in the year. The students and staff have worked together to create a fantastic learning community and we are so pleased to share that we are well above State, Similar School and Network percentages in positive responses to all aspects of the school survey. A couple of key area to share is that the data shows **98%** of our Grade



4-6 students gave a positive response to questions relating to stimulating learning **environment**. This is compared to the State of 77%, Similar School 78% and the Network 77%. Also, in relation to effective classroom behaviour 92% of our student provided a positive response compared to State 77%, Similar School 78% and Network School 76%. It is important to note that our results in all categories are well above State and Similar School averages and this reflects the work our staff do in meeting individual needs of our students. We are very

proud of the learning environment our students, families and staff have created at Carrum Primary School and continue to look at ways to improve what we do to support our students find success at school.

Our staff have been reviewing our 2024 NAPLAN data during staff meetings this term and there are some very positive results that reflect the excellent work our staff have been doing. One of the areas of focus has been on our Grade 5 students results in Reading, Writing and Numeracy. These assessments tend to be the main areas of focus by the Department of Education when reviewing school performance. Once again, our students



have done very well in these assessments with our students as a cohort performing on average well above State and Similar School comparisons. Some of the main areas of improvement have come with the students learning growth data as we have seen a continued



improvement this year. These results have allowed our staff to reflect on what we are doing well and what areas we need to continue to work on to support our students with their learning. We continue to focus on our Explicit Instruction Model and the sequence of our units of work to support students with applying this knowledge to real world application tasks. It is through the application of these skills that our students are able to commit their learning to their long-term memory and recall these skills more readily.



SUPPORT YOUR CHILD'S EDUCATION WITH FREE INTERNET AT HOME UNTIL DECEMBER 2025

The School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI) is a Federal Government initiative offering free home internet to 30,000 unconnected households with school-aged students. Households have until **Tuesday 31 December 2024** to apply. Free services will continue until 31 December 2025.

The initiative seeks to boost educational opportunities and narrow the digital divide.

To be eligible, households must:

- have a child living at home that is enrolled in an Australian school (up to year 12 including Prep)
- not have an active NBN Co. network internet service at home (excludes mobile internet services)
- live in a premises that can access the NBN Co. network via a standard connection
- not have had an active NBN Co. connection during the previous 14 days.

To be assessed, please contact the NBN National Referral Centre on **1800 954 610** or visit anglicarevic.org.au/student-internet to request a call back. Please note:

- NBN will check your nominated home address for an active NBN connection.
- You do not need to provide financial information.
- Translation and interpretation services are available.

Some families might also be contacted via their school with information about how to apply. The Victorian Department of Education has been working with the NBN to review Victorian school student home addresses. Only home addresses have been provided to NBN to check. No other personal information has been shared with NBN. NBN handles this data in accordance with privacy law.
